## STONE MOUNTAIN DAY TRIP –SATURDAY, JUNE 18TH

Audubon members and friends are invited to join us for a TGPAS/Piedmont Bird Club day trip to Stone Mountain on Saturday, June 18<sup>th</sup>. Stone Mountain State Park offers recreational opportunities for birders, hikers, and history buffs. The trails vary in length and difficulty. For a view of meadows and woods, try the half-mile self-guided nature trail and learn about the park's geology and vegetation. The 1.5-mile Wolf Rock Trail provides views of the Blue Ridge Mountain escarpment with ridges defining three watersheds. For those who want a strenuous hike, the 4-mile Stone Mountain Loop Trail leads to the summit of Stone Mountain—a 600-foot granite dome—then to the top of Stone Mountain Falls, and down to the meadow at the base of the mountain. Given its proximity to the Blue Ridge, we expect to see a number nesting warbler species, flycatchers and tanagers, as well as a variety of raptors including Broad-winged and Sharp-shinned hawks.
